**THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES,**

To the Marshal of the Western District of Louisiana, or his lawful Deputy,

**GREETING:**

You are hereby Commanded, that you demand from *Pierre Lafitte* the sum of *Seventy one Dollars and forty seven cents* <sup>cash,</sup> which, *the United States of America* lately recovered by judgment of the District Court of the United States for the Western District of Louisiana, and if *he* shall not pay the same in three days after demand, that then you cause the same to be made out of the personal Estate of said *Pierre Lafitte* except slaves, in your District, if sufficient personal estate, exclusive of slaves, can be found therein; but if sufficient personal Estate of said *Pierre Lafitte* exclusive of slaves, cannot be found in your District, that then you cause the said sum to be made of the real Estate and Slaves of the said *Pierre Lafitte* in your District, whereof *he* was owner, on the *15<sup>th</sup>* day of *June 1834* last past, into whose hands soever the same may have come, and that you have those monies before our said Court, to render to the said *United States of America* for the judgment aforesaid, on the *Third Monday of March 1835* together with the writ.
