PROCEEDINGS

(August 25, 2016)

\*\*\*\*\*

(COURT CALLED TO ORDER)

**THE COURT:** Be seated, please. Good morning, ladies and gentlemen. We're back in our courtroom. We've got most of the things worked out. Some of the bugs are still around, but we'll see what we can do about that.

Let's call the case, Dean.

**THE DEPUTY CLERK:** MDL-2047, *In re: Chinese-Manufactured Drywall Products Liability Litigation.*

**THE COURT:** Counsel, make their appearance for the record, please.

**MR. HERMAN:** May it please the Court. Good morning, Judge Fallon. Russ Herman for the Plaintiffs' Steering Committee and plaintiffs.

**MR. ROSENBERG:** Good morning, Your Honor. Harry Rosenberg, liaison counsel for CNBM, BNBM and Taishan, Your Honor, and I hope I'm not one of the bugs that are still around.

**THE COURT:** Okay.

**MR. MILLER:** Good morning, Judge. Kerry Miller for Knauf.

**THE COURT:** Okay. We're here today for our monthly

09:10 1 status conference. I met a moment ago with liaison and lead  
09:10 2 counsel to discuss the agenda. We have a short agenda today.

09:10 3 First up is BrownGreer's report.

09:11 4 **MR. WOODY:** Thank you, Your Honor. It's Jake Woody  
09:11 5 from BrownGreer. I have a very brief report for you today.

09:11 6 **THE COURT:** Okay.

09:11 7 **MR. WOODY:** On August 2nd, 2016, we mailed checks  
09:11 8 totaling about \$17.1 million, which represents the amount left  
09:11 9 in the other loss fund, for disbursement. The only money that  
09:11 10 we have left to disburse from that account is money that's for  
09:11 11 claimants who have not yet returned a W-9 and a verification of  
09:11 12 claims form. There are very few of those.

09:11 13 And we mailed those checks to counsel or to pro  
09:11 14 se claimants directly. If you've not received a check, you --  
09:11 15 people can contact us at [cdwquestions@browngreer.com](mailto:cdwquestions@browngreer.com). We can  
09:11 16 reissue checks, or we can send you the documents that you need  
09:11 17 to return to us.

09:11 18 But that represents the bulk of the money from  
09:11 19 the other loss fund, and we can close that chapter of the  
09:11 20 settlement agreement in large part.

09:12 21 And we also have amounts left to disburse from  
09:12 22 the Global/Banner/InEx funds for the same reason: People  
09:12 23 haven't returned payment documentation. Again, I urge people  
09:12 24 to contact us if they think they are owed money that they  
09:12 25 haven't yet received.

09:12 1 And we're also working closely with Knauf --  
09:12 2 Kerry Miller is here and will speak in a moment about -- more  
09:12 3 about this, but to resolve some of the outstanding assignment  
09:12 4 issues and the remediation issues as well.

09:12 5 **THE COURT:** Okay. After a reasonable time, give me a  
09:12 6 list of those that are still out, and I'll either talk to the  
09:12 7 attorney who represents those individuals or make some effort  
09:12 8 to notify the people from the Web site.

09:12 9 Thank you.

09:12 10 **MR. WOODY:** Yes, sir. We'll do that.

09:12 11 **THE COURT:** Okay.

09:12 12 **MR. WOODY:** Thank you.

09:12 13 **THE COURT:** Okay.

09:12 14 **MR. MILLER:** Good morning, again, Your Honor, Kerry  
09:12 15 Miller. And on that note, what I'd like to present to the  
09:12 16 Court, and to those who are listening on the phone and here in  
09:12 17 the courtroom, is that with respect to the remaining aspects of  
09:12 18 the administration and the operation of the Knauf settlement,  
09:13 19 what we have left, Your Honor, is very small.

09:13 20 As the Court is aware, there are two basic  
09:13 21 aspects to the Knauf settlement. One is the remediation  
09:13 22 program, and the other is the already remediated homes program,  
09:13 23 and that relates to homeowners who fixed their houses  
09:13 24 themselves and then claimed reimbursement against the  
09:13 25 settlement.

09:13 1 With respect to the remediation program, that's  
09:13 2 been administered by Moss as the lead contractor working in  
09:13 3 conjunction with BrownGreer, and we are aware of only eight  
09:13 4 homes left in that program, Your Honor.

09:13 5 With respect to the -- and that was out of  
09:13 6 3,000. So hardly anything left.

09:13 7 With respect to the already remediated homes  
09:13 8 program, that was a smaller universe, around 500. But we are  
09:13 9 aware of less than eight that are outstanding as of today.

09:13 10 And so, Your Honor, what we'd like to do on  
09:13 11 behalf of Knauf, Moss, and work with Jake at BrownGreer, is put  
09:13 12 out a notice prior to next month's status conference.

09:14 13 We'll identify the outstanding claims that we're  
09:14 14 aware of on both sides of our ledger, from Knauf's standpoint,  
09:14 15 remediation/already remediated, and ask that if anyone has or  
09:14 16 is aware of any other outstanding claims to identify them  
09:14 17 quickly so that they can be addressed, and so Moss, Knauf and  
09:14 18 BrownGreer can wrap up its administrative duties, hopefully, by  
09:14 19 the end of the year.

09:14 20 **THE COURT:** Okay. When you get to that, give me a  
09:14 21 notice of that and I'll post it on the Web site so that  
09:14 22 everybody at least has access to it and can take appropriate  
09:14 23 action.

09:14 24 **MR. MILLER:** Yeah. So we'll file a notice before  
09:14 25 next month's conference, and we'll post it to ECF and to

09:14 1 LexisNexis, and we'll make sure it gets up on the Court's Web  
09:14 2 site.

09:14 3 Thank you, Judge.

09:14 4 **THE COURT:** Okay. Thank you, Kerry.

09:14 5 The next item is Taishan. Anything?

09:15 6 **MR. ROSENBERG:** None, Your Honor, from our  
09:15 7 standpoint.

09:15 8 **THE COURT:** Okay. All right.

09:15 9 **MR. HERMAN:** May it please the Court, at page 12,  
09:15 10 Venture Supply in Virginia. Venture Supply assigned its third  
09:15 11 party claims against Taishan. The matter is before Judge Hall.  
09:15 12 Riched Serpe is lead counsel in that matter.

09:15 13 Then, Your Honor, at page 13, Your Honor,  
09:15 14 Mr. Balhoff, who has been appointed by the Court with respect  
09:15 15 to certain matters dealing with Knauf attorney fees, he's  
09:16 16 present, and I don't know whether he wants to address the Court  
09:16 17 or not.

09:16 18 **THE COURT:** Do you have anything?

09:16 19 I might say this: This case is interesting in  
09:16 20 the sense that ordinarily in these types of cases, MDLs, the  
09:16 21 attorney's fee, unlike in class actions, comes from the  
09:16 22 contract attorney's fee. The first step, oftentimes, is to  
09:16 23 decide how much the fee should be, and that is a question in  
09:16 24 some cases.

09:16 25 In this particular case, as part of the

09:16 1 settlement, the Knauf interests agreed to pay attorney's fees,  
09:16 2 plus remediation. So the attorney's fees are 190-some-odd  
09:17 3 million dollars, close to \$200 million, and the question there  
09:17 4 is it contains both the contract fees and the common benefit  
09:17 5 fee. That's the pot. So a decision has to be made as to how  
09:17 6 that pot is to split between the contract attorneys and the  
09:17 7 common benefit attorneys.

09:17 8 I appointed a committee, a fee allocation  
09:17 9 committee, comprised of the people who have tried cases or who  
09:17 10 have been active in the litigation, both in this court and in  
09:17 11 state court, to interview any and all people who are interested  
09:17 12 in a common benefit fee, and to make some recommendations as to  
09:18 13 the split.

09:18 14 I got that, and I posted it on the Web site, and  
09:18 15 then invited any objections. There have been several  
09:18 16 objections. At that point, I appointed Dan Balhoff to deal  
09:18 17 with that aspect of the case. So he either has or intends to  
09:18 18 meet with the objectors to discuss some mechanism by which they  
09:18 19 can present their objection, and he can make some  
09:18 20 recommendation to me.

09:18 21 I've also, of course, directed our CPA to  
09:18 22 summarize all of the time and all the costs attributable to the  
09:18 23 common benefit aspect of the case.

09:18 24 At the outset, I appointed the CPA, and I  
09:19 25 directed the attorneys who are doing common benefit work, not

09:19 1 only the PSC, but everybody doing common benefit work, to  
09:19 2 periodically, but contemporaneously, reply to the CPA and tell  
09:19 3 the CPA on a monthly basis the time that they were logging, and  
09:19 4 what they were doing with the time.

09:19 5 We had various codes, "deposition" is one of  
09:19 6 them, "trial preparation" is another one, "expert preparation,"  
09:19 7 "monitoring," and so forth. So not only do they report the  
09:19 8 time spent, but the nature of the work during that time.

09:19 9 I meet with the CPA on a monthly basis, go over  
09:19 10 that matter with him, and that way I'm kept up to speed on  
09:19 11 who's doing what in the litigation and what's happening. I put  
09:20 12 those reports under seal until such time as the case is  
09:20 13 completed or resolved, and then I open it up.

09:20 14 But at this point, I've had him summarize all of  
09:20 15 those monthly reports to me and give me one summary. So I now  
09:20 16 know who did what and what type of work they did, and I have  
09:20 17 various categories that I have it divided in.

09:20 18 So at the point that, hopefully soon, I'll have  
09:20 19 before me the recommendations of the allocation committee, the  
09:20 20 recommendations of the special master, and my own knowledge of  
09:20 21 the case and who's doing what and when they were doing it, and  
09:20 22 all of the CPA material, then I'll be able at that point to  
09:21 23 make some decision on it.

09:21 24 **MR. BALHOFF:** Your Honor, just to make a public  
09:21 25 report of what has been going on and what I intend to go on in

09:21 1 the near future. Since my appointment, I have met with several  
09:21 2 attorneys, both from the fee committee and from the objectors.  
09:21 3 I've also spoken on the telephone and communicated by e-mail  
09:21 4 with attorneys. I've sent out some mass e-mails outlining my  
09:21 5 thoughts of the preliminary process.

09:21 6 What I recognize, after reading many of the  
09:21 7 materials that have been submitted in the public record so far,  
09:21 8 is that, in addition to the fee committee's position, the  
09:21 9 objectors don't have a single position, but have a number of  
09:21 10 positions. Some do not take -- some don't intersect with  
09:22 11 others, but it is going to be important moving forward for  
09:22 12 process purposes that I be dealing with liaison on many of the  
09:22 13 process issues.

09:22 14 I intend to appoint a liaison in the next couple  
09:22 15 of days, but that will not shut out those objectors who are not  
09:22 16 liaison from communicating with me to the extent they have  
09:22 17 different issues.

09:22 18 I also intend to take a couple of other  
09:22 19 preliminary steps in the next few days, such as refine the  
09:22 20 Rule 53 appointment. And, also, the first substantive step  
09:22 21 that's already in the works is to decide what discovery we need  
09:22 22 to do as a first step.

09:22 23 Rather than plan on a long-range case management  
09:22 24 order, or anything along those lines, it is my hope to identify  
09:23 25 that written discovery that needs to be done in order to inform

09:23 1 each side of what they need in order to make a record for  
09:23 2 yourself, and, if necessary, for the Fifth Circuit.

09:23 3 **THE COURT:** Okay.

09:23 4 **MR. BALHOFF:** I then intend to do that with an eye  
09:23 5 toward who will need to be deposed on the back end of that.

09:23 6 The first meeting I had was with Phil Garrett.  
09:23 7 The CPA appointed by the Court has set me up with a portal to  
09:23 8 where I can look at what has been submitted to him. It is  
09:23 9 possible that Mr. Garrett will be deposed, but we shall see.

09:23 10 I will work with the parties to make sure that  
09:23 11 everyone has an opportunity to do all the discovery that is  
09:23 12 necessary. On the other hand, I will discourage any  
09:23 13 unnecessary discovery as a waste of time and money for all  
09:23 14 parties concerned. Again, though, I'm going to make sure that  
09:23 15 no one is shut out in any way from discovery.

09:24 16 All of that is with an eye toward holding a  
09:24 17 hearing, having everybody put on the record what is necessary  
09:24 18 for Your Honor, for the Fifth Circuit, and making a  
09:24 19 recommendation to the Court.

09:24 20 **THE COURT:** Good. Okay. Thank you very much, and  
09:24 21 I'll be meeting with you, Dan, after this meeting.

09:24 22 **MR. BALHOFF:** Thank you, Your Honor.

09:24 23 **THE COURT:** I think the important thing is, from the  
09:24 24 attorney's fees, as I see it, is that we have some process, and  
09:24 25 also some transparency. So I put all of this on the Web site

09:24 1 at the appropriate time so that everybody has access to it.

09:24 2 Okay. What's next?

09:24 3 **MR. HERMAN:** May it please the Court, Judge Fallon,  
09:24 4 as Your Honor knows, the parties will be meeting on the 29th of  
09:24 5 this month in Philadelphia with further discussions.

09:24 6 And the three matters regarding stipend at page  
09:24 7 16 and 17 are submitted without argument.

09:25 8 And the hearing date for the next hearing, Your  
09:25 9 Honor.

09:25 10 **THE COURT:** Okay. The next one is September 22nd,  
09:25 11 and the following one is October the 20th.

09:25 12 Harry, do you have anything?

09:25 13 **MR. ROSENBERG:** Nothing, Your Honor. Thank you.

09:25 14 **THE COURT:** Okay. All right, folks. Court will  
09:25 15 stand in recess.

09:25 16 (WHEREUPON, the proceedings were concluded.)
