A pretrial status conference was held Thursday, June 26, 2003 at 9:00 a.m. in the courtroom of Judge Eldon E. Fallon. In attendance for Plaintiffs wereLeonard Davis, Arnold Levin, Charles Zimmerman, John L. Olivier, Rebecca Cunard, Julie Jacobs, Dawn Barrios, Blaine Barrilleaux, Robert Caluda, and Daniel E. Becnel, Jr. In attendance for the Defendants were James Irwin, Thomas Campion, Charles Preuss, and Monique Garsaud. At the conference, counsel reported to the Court on the topics set forth in Joint Report No. 24 of Plaintiffs' and Defendants' Liaison Counsel.

# 1. <u>Update to Rolling Document Production and Electronic Document Production</u>

Plaintiffs' Liaison Counsel ("PLC") advised the Court that no further document production is contemplated by Defendants. PLC is reviewing the discovery produced.

#### 2. State Liaison Counsel

State Liaison Counsel ("SLC") advised the Court that it had scheduled meetings with representatives of the PLC to discuss the PLC's Motion to Withdraw Funds from the Registry of the Court. The Court indicated that it would look to counsel first to resolve any outstanding issues before seeking the Court's intervention.

## 3. Plaintiff Profile Forms and Authorizations

Defense Liaison Counsel ("DLC") advised the Court that as of June 20, 2003, the defendants had received 2,256 PPFs, 169 are overdue, and 64 will become due within 30 days.

DLC also brought for hearing a Motion to Dismiss with Prejudice those plaintiffs whose PPFs are overdue [Record Doc. No. 1207]. DLC provided a Court with a list of those plaintiffs subject to this motion and a list of those plaintiffs no longer subject to this motion. The PLC objected to the dismissal of these cases without prejudice, but the Court overruled that motion for reasons given at the hearing as well as at previous hearings. Accordingly, IT IS ORDERED that the DLC's Motion is GRANTED IN PART AND DENIED IN PART. The motion is GRANTED as to those plaintiffs listed in Exhibit A to this Minute Entry and DENIED as to those plaintiffs listed in Exhibit B to this Minute Entry.

DLC shall in due course submit an appropriate judgment pursuant to Rule 54(b) of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure as to those plaintiffs dismissed.

## 4. <u>Service List of Attorneys</u>

DLC provided the Court with an updated list of attorneys in the MDL case as well as related state court cases.

## 5. <u>Third Party Subpoena Duces Tecum</u>

PLC indicated that Medicom was in the process of preparing a certification that it has no

documents responsive to the PLC's subpoena. PLC further reported that the Degge Group had produced documents on June 13, 2003 in response to the PLC's subpoenas and was preparing a privilege log as to other documents.

## 6. <u>Motion for Class Certification</u>

In an Order dated June 27, 2002, this Court indicated that it would in due course set a hearing date in connection with the PSC's second motion for class certification [MDL Document No. 619]. PLC and DLC requested that this Court defer setting a hearing on this issue.

## 7. <u>Plaintiffs' and Defendants' Respective Requests for Production of Documents</u>

DLC indicated that it would be providing two supplemental responses to the Plaintiffs' Merit Interrogatories to Defendants – Set No. 7. The Court ORDERED DLC to provide its first supplemental response no later than July 4, 2003 and to inform the PLC by that date as to the expected time for completion of the second supplemental response.

## 8. Trust Account

As noted above, the SLC and PLC are meeting to discuss the PLC's Motion to Withdraw Funds from the Registry of the Court and shall inform the Court of the progress of those meetings.

## 9. Declassified Documents

The parties advised that they had nothing new to report on this issue.

## 10. Mediation

PLC advised the Court that 13 cases were scheduled for mediation with the court-appointed mediator during the first week of August, 2003. The Court advised counsel wishing to participate in the mediation to contact the PLC for information.

## 11. <u>Trial of Louisiana Cases</u>

The Court indicated its desire to set trials of Louisiana cases in the months of October, November, or December, 2003. The Court further stated that it would look to counsel to determine which cases were ready to trial. Specifically, the Court advised counsel to establish categories for the types of cases ready for trial. The Court instructed counsel to contact it during the week of June 30, 2003 to schedule a status conference for the purpose of selecting trial dates.

## 12. <u>Pharmacy Indemnity Agreements</u>

DLC advised that it continues to produce copies of all pharmacy indemnity agreements to the PLC.

## 13. End Game Planning Committee

The End Game Planning Committee indicated that it was meeting and would continue to update the Court on the progress of its discussion.

## 14. <u>Motions to Withdraw</u>

Counsel advised the Court that several plaintiffs' attorneys have filed motions to withdraw as counsel of record. The Court advised that it would not permit counsel to withdraw from representation unless new counsel was thereby added. The Court further instructed counsel seeking to substitute to first contact PLC and DLC and discuss proposed substitutions.

### 15. Motion to Withdraw in the Matter of Donald Anderson, Civil Action 02-3518

This matter was addressed in the Court's Minute Entry dated June 26, 2003.

## 16. <u>Scheduling of Next Pretrial Status Conference</u>

The next pretrial status conference will be held on Thursday, August 14, 2003 at 9:00 a.m.
