ORDER

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the parties SHALL adhere to the following provisions in preparation for trial:

Any motions, including motions in limine regarding the admissibility of expert testimony (Daubert motions) SHALL be filed no later than December 31, 2002. Any oppositions thereto SHALL be filed no later than January 24, 2003, with replies to those oppositions being due no later than January 28, 2003. A *Daubert* hearing regarding the admissibility of expert testimony SHALL be held on February 3, 2003 at 9:00 a.m. in the Courtroom of Judge Eldon E. Fallon.

All other motions, except motions in limine regarding the admissibility of expert testimony SHALL be filed in sufficient time to permit hearing thereon no later than February 19, 2003.

Trial will commence on the dates mentioned above before Judge Fallon with a jury at 8:30 a.m. Attorneys are instructed to report for trial not later than 30 minutes prior to this time. The starting time on the first day of a jury trial may be delayed or moved up because of jury pooling.
